Funding

This financial year's (April 2020 – March 2021) allocation is **£16140**. This funding is targeted on those children receiving Free School meals and are on Ever6 and whose additional needs require support.

- Learning mentor hours. JL works with most of the PPG children, ensuring their SEMH needs are met in school. JL managed to accrue 3 laptops from Lancaster City Council for PPG children last year – this allowed them to access remote learning.
- 8 hours additional learning support per week in UKS2 to meet learning needs. 4 PPG children in Amethyst class and 2 in Sapphire will benefit from this
- Subsidised trips, especially Coniston, allow PPG children to access curricular enrichment and enhancement
- 2xPPG children attend wraparound care to enable parent to work without worrying about childcare costs.

In summer term 2021...

Barriers

100% of those children receiving PPG qualified for free school meals due to families receiving any of the following benefits: Income support, Income-based jobseekers' allowance, Income-related employment and support allowance

33% of those children receiving PPG for FSM have significant difficulties at home, which would be a barrier to learning.

22% have barriers that are social, emotional, mental health

22% of those children receiving PPG for FSM are SEND and have regular reviews

Impact

The children therefore accessed the recommended 3-5 hours by the government of teaching and learning throughout lockdown. 40% of children on FSM have struggled to settle back into school, thus requiring more support from learning mentor. Regular meetings undertaken between teachers and parents.
