Covid

We continue to see Covid cases in school. This is inevitable at the moment with cases still high in the local area. Please ensure that your child doesn't come to school if they have any symptoms of Covid – you should immediately book a PCR test.

LFTs are for asymptomatic cases: if your child has a positive LFT, this becomes day 0 of their isolation. They can then return to school on day 6 or beyond, following 2 negative tests 24 hours apart.

Close contacts of a positive test are recommended to LFT for 7 days as an added precaution.

Thank you all for your patience as we continue to work to interpret the guidance effectively for our school.
